Annual Surviving Spouses Legal Brief

The MOAA St. Petersburg Chapter was honored to host two distinguished veteran advocates at this year's Annual Surviving Spouses Veterans Administration Benefits Legal Brief. Both speakers, themselves military veterans, brought powerful insight, legal expertise, and a deep commitment to helping veterans and their families navigate the often-complex VA benefits system.

Brian Keisacker, Esq. – Veterans Affairs Law Firm, P.A.

VA-accredited attorney Brian Keisacker is a fifth-generation Sarasota native who began his service to our country as a U.S. Air Force medical laboratory technician at Walston Army Hospital on Fort Dix, New Jersey. After his honorable service, he continued in the medical field before pursuing his legal education at Stetson University College of Law, where he graduated *cum laude*.

William “Bill” Sterbinsky, Esq. – Veterans Affairs Law Firm, P.A.

Marine Corps veteran Bill Sterbinsky enlisted at 17 and served in Iraq as a Security Forces Marine with 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines, Weapons Company, in the Al Qaim Province. After separating from the military, he pursued a history degree at the University of South Florida, where his own frustrating experiences with VA claims sparked a passion for reform.

Both Brian and Bill continue to champion veteran and survivor rights with fierce dedication and compassion.



Their presentation during our Annual Surviving Spouses Brief was a vital resource, offering clarity, actionable advice, and—most importantly—hope to those navigating the VA system.

Understanding VA Compensation: Key Takeaways from the Annual Surviving Spouses Legal Brief

As part of our ongoing support for surviving spouses, the legal brief included a comprehensive presentation on *VA Compensation and Survivor Benefits*, expertly delivered by Mr. Keisacker and Mr. Sterbinsky. Their session demystified the most critical benefit programs and helped attendees understand how to effectively pursue their entitled claims.

Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC)

This tax-free monetary benefit is available to surviving spouses, dependent children, or parents of veterans whose death resulted from a service-connected condition—or in some cases, from non-service-connected causes if the veteran held a 100% VA disability rating for at least 10 years.

Key points:

- Filing within one year of the veteran's death ensures retroactive benefits.
- DIC eligibility can be restored to a surviving spouse if a later marriage ends.
- Deaths deemed related to a

service-connected condition may qualify even if not officially filed before passing.

Survivor's Pension & Aid and Attendance

This income-based pension supports survivors of wartime veterans with financial need. For those who are house-bound or need help with daily activities, the *Aid and Attendance* supplement may apply. Survivors must meet both income limits and asset thresholds (currently \$159,240 net worth), and the benefit includes a three-year look-back period for asset transfers.

Accrued Benefits

If a veteran had a pending claim or was owed back benefits at the time of death, survivors may be eligible for *accrued benefits*. This requires timely filing (Form 21P-534EZ) and supporting documentation such as the marriage license, death certificate, and banking details for EFT. Survivors should always check the "accrued benefits" box when completing applications.

Filing Tips and Critical Forms

- ☐ **Form 21P-534a:** For deaths on active duty
- ☐ **Form 21P-535:** For surviving parents
- ☐ **Forms 0995 / 0996 / 10182:** For supplemental claims, higher-level reviews, and Board of Veterans' Appeals, respectively
- ☐ **Form 21P-0847:** Important for accrued benefits
- ☐ **Form 572EZ:** For survivor's pension (requires asset review)

Survivors are encouraged to document prior marriages (for both parties) to avoid claim delays and to keep all buri-

al-related receipts for reimbursement when applicable.

Choosing the Right Advocate

The presenters emphasized the importance of choosing an experienced and trustworthy advocate. While attorney fees are capped by federal regulations (typically 20%), survivors should ensure their legal representative is VA-accredited, knowledgeable, and communicative. Filing claims correctly and timely is essential to avoiding costly delays.

The MOAA St. Petersburg Chapter also wishes to recognize and thank the Veterans Affairs Law Firm, P.A. for their unwavering dedication to helping veterans throughout our region obtain increased VA disability ratings. Their tireless efforts have directly contributed to reducing the number of homeless veterans in Pinellas County and have empowered many of our combat veterans to achieve greater independence and stability. By ensuring our heroes receive the benefits they have rightfully earned, Mr. Keisacker and Mr. Sterbinsky are not only changing individual lives—they are strengthening our entire community.

The MOAA St. Petersburg Chapter extends its deepest appreciation to Mr. Keisacker and Mr. Sterbinsky for their time, dedication, and continued advocacy on behalf of those who served—and the loved ones they leave behind. Their work empowers surviving spouses with both knowledge and confidence as they navigate the path forward.

How do I apply for compensation?

First you'll need to fill out an application for benefits.

The application you fill out will depend on your survivor status.

If you're the surviving spouse or child of a service member who died while on active duty, your military casualty assistance officer will help you to complete an Application for Dependency and Indemnity Compensation by a Surviving Spouse or Child (VA Form 21P-534a). The officer will help you mail the form to the correct VA regional office.

If you're the surviving spouse or child of a Veteran, fill out an Application for DIC, Survivors Pension, and/or Accrued Benefits (VA Form 21P-534EZ).

Did you know...

Where does the term National Guard come from?

200 Years ago, this month...

14 July 1825 – The visit of the Marquis de Lafayette to America in 1824-1825 was in every sense a triumphal procession. The 2nd Battalion, 11th New York Artillery, was one of many militia turned out to welcome him. This unit decided to adopt the title "**National Guard**" in honor of Lafayette's command of the Garde Nationale de Paris during the French Revolution. The 11th Battalion, later designated as the 7th Regiment, was prominent in the line of march on the occasion of Lafayette's final passage through New York en route home to France. Taking note of the troops named for his old command he alighted from his carriage walked down the line clasping each officer by the hand as he proceeded. The 7th New York, with its designation "National Guard" went on to become one of the most famous of all Guard units well into the 20th century. Its nickname has come to represent all American militia for more than century...

Legislative Action

Greetings – serving, retired and former Officers and Surviving Spouses.

As this is written at the end of June 2025, all attention is focused on the 2025 Omnibus Tax Bill.

MOAA continues to advocate on our behalf, pursuing the following issues:

Add Military Spouses to the Work Opportunity Tax Credit

Congress must incentivize employers to hire military spouses by adding them as a target group under the Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) program.

Congress Needs to Address the Hazardous Unaccompanied Housing Conditions Rampant in the Military

Thousands of servicemembers live in unsafe, sub-standard military housing due to years of underfunding and lack of oversight. This is a continuing national scandal which must be finally remedied.

Fund to Deliver Toxic-Exposed Veterans the Care They've Earned

Millions of veterans exposed to toxic substances during their service have been forced to wait years, before they can access VA care and benefits for service-connected illnesses. Congress must insist on the creation of presumptive conditions to guarantee timely care.

Honor Veteran Caregivers - Pass the Reeducation, Reemployment, and Retirement Act

Congress is urged to pass the Veteran Caregiver Reeducation, Reemployment, and Retirement Act to provide caregivers with the education, employment, and retirement support they deserve.

Advocate for the Major Richard Star Act

Contact your representative and senators and urge them to support the Major Richard Star Act, which will authorize combat-injured veterans to receive their full DoD retirement pay earned for years of service and their full VA disability compensation for lifelong injury.

Restore Full BAH for All Servicemembers

Insist that Congress restore full Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) for all military families.

Urge Your Representative to Cosponsor the Support Military Families Act

Contact our representative the Honorable Ana Paulina Luna and urge her to cosponsor the Support Military Families Act to ensure military spouses who work for the federal government can keep their jobs and support their service members and families.

Restore Parity for Surviving Spouses: Increase Dependency and Indemnity Compensation

Bipartisan legislation in the House (H.R. 680) aligns Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) payments with other federal survivor benefits. Support passage of this law.

Love Lives On: Protect Surviving Spouses' Right to Remarry

Urge our elected representatives to support the Love Lives On Act to secure the right for surviving military spouses to remarry at any age and retain their benefits.
